Sailing route

Dubrovnik – Ston/Peljesac Peninsula/Trstenik – Korčula Town – Hvar Town - Stari Grad (Island Hvar) - Šolta - Split (or nearby port TBA)

The itinerary may operate in reverse order while keeping the same port stops. We plan to confirm the final cruise direction by June 2026, well before flight schedules open. Due to construction at the Port of Split, embarkation and disembarkation may take place at a nearby port, such as Trogir. Port stops are subject to change due to weather, port availability, and operational requirements.

Overview



Imagine a place far from home where the “borders” are traced by sunlit shorelines, and home is simply wherever the anchor drops. Off Croatia’s rugged, island-studded coast, you might slip into the Adriatic for a late-day swim beside a quiet, uninhabited cove as the sun sinks into the sea. As twilight settles, the world grows still, with only the gentle rhythm of waves against the hull. It feels like paradise.

Croatia’s Adriatic is made for this kind of journey. With roughly 5,800 km of coastline and more than 1,000 islands, the shore is famously indented and endlessly varied, from cliff-lined headlands and hidden bays to storybook villages rich with history and Mediterranean charm. Many beaches and coves are reachable only by sea, which is exactly why Croatia has become one of the world’s great sailing destinations.

Join Ellis Paul and Radoslav Lorković for eight unforgettable days and seven nights cruising the breathtaking Dalmatian coastline aboard a privately chartered vessel. Our home at sea is MS Antaris, a premier luxury small ship with just 19 cabins, offering the rare feeling of an intimate yacht experience with the ease and comfort of a well-run cruise. Each day blends relaxed time on deck with a thoughtfully curated mix of historic coastal towns, elegant harbors, and quiet island villages.

An English-speaking professional cruise manager travels with us throughout the week, and in ports we’ll enjoy guided walking tours led by certified local guides. Between destinations, we’ll pause for swim stops right off the back of the ship in crystal-clear Adriatic waters. Throughout the week, enjoy intimate onboard concerts under the stars and special moments with Ellis and Rad. You’ll also enjoy a comfortable cabin with a private bath, air-conditioning, and free onboard Wi-Fi.

Meals are part of the pleasure: daily breakfast, six three-course lunches, a Welcome Dinner, and a festive Captain’s Dinner, all freshly prepared and served onboard. Most evenings are yours to enjoy at your own pace, whether that means lingering at waterfront cafés, sampling local cuisine, savoring gelato, or soaking up the relaxed energy along the riva.

Saturday, September 18 - Dubrovnik (Embarkation)



Welcome to Dubrovnik, the "Pearl of the Adriatic". Embarkation is on Saturday at 2PM. Check in, settle into your cabin, and meet Ellis and Rad along with your fellow travelers as we begin our week together. Following a welcome briefing, join us for a private sightseeing tour of the UNESCO protected Old Town, with time to take in the most iconic sights and hear the stories that shaped this remarkable city.

Surrounded by its fabled medieval walls, Dubrovnik is a medieval city on the Adriatic coastline, and a treasure trove of cultural and historical monuments created throughout its thousand-year existence. In the past, it was a City-Republic, and alongside Venice one of the most famous cultural-economic centers on the Mediterranean. In more recent times, it has become the center of modern cultural and tourist events: a city of summer festivals, an international parade of top musical and theatrical achievements, a city of museums and galleries. These values have turned Dubrovnik into a place that offers a rich selection of various experiences and excitement, but also a complete holiday in a quiet and calming, mild Mediterranean ambience and wonderful seaside landscapes. After the walking tour, there will be free time to explore the Old Town, stroll Stradun, enjoy gelato or a drink, and have dinner on your own inside the city walls.

Back on board later in the evening. Overnight in Dubrovnik.

Sunday, September 19 - Slano / Pelješac Peninsula (Ston and Trstenik)



In the morning, while breakfast is served, we set sail for Slano, a small village about 20 miles from Dubrovnik. A swim stop is planned. After lunch on board, we will head by bus on our private journey toward the Pelješac Peninsula and the town of Ston. Pelješac is a peninsula in southern Croatia, in Dubrovnik-Neretva County. It is about 70 km long and connects to the Croatian mainland at Ston. The Pelješac Channel divides the peninsula from the island of Korčula. Scattered like breadcrumbs across the foothills of the Dolomites, the hamlets and villages of southern Pelješac evoke an ancient past.

By bus, we will visit the town of Ston, home to one of Europe's longest stone walls (5.5 km). The walls were reinforced with 40 towers and five fortresses. Originally 7 km long, they were partially destroyed in the 1667 earthquake. After the Dubrovnik Republic acquired the Pelješac Peninsula in 1334, it sought to protect Ston and began constructing these defensive walls. This extensive complex was built from 1334 to 1506 and, at the time, was the largest fortification and urban-planning project in Europe. You will have free time in Ston to explore the city walls and saltworks.

Afterward, we will visit a family-owned winery for a local wine tasting. After a few glasses of wine, we will drive across the peninsula to the small village of Trstenik, where we will rejoin our ship.

Welcome dinner on board, followed by a concert with Ellis and Rad. Overnight in Trstenik.

Monday, September 20 - Korčula



Breakfast and lunch on board and sailing towards the island of Korčula, with a swim stop along the way. Korčula is one of the greenest islands in the Adriatic Sea, with abundant vineyards and olive groves that have shaped local life for centuries. The dense woods led the original Greek settlers to call the island Korkyra Melaina (Black Korčula). Quiet coves and small sandy beaches dot the steep southern coast, while the northern shore is flatter and pebbly, offering plenty of inviting spots for a swim and a slow afternoon by the sea.

The main city of the island, also named Korčula, is a beautifully preserved medieval town set on a small peninsula. Ringed by imposing defenses, this coastal citadel is dripping in history, with marble streets rich in Renaissance and Gothic architecture. The old town's layout is famously designed like a fishbone, with narrow lanes branching off the main street to catch cooling breezes in summer and provide shelter in winter. As you wander, you will notice carved stone balconies, historic churches, and hidden courtyards that feel untouched by time.

Our private local guide will take you on a unique tour of the old town of Korčula. You will hear many interesting stories and legends about the city, from seafaring traditions and island rivalries to the customs that still mark local life today. It is still most famous as the birthplace of Marco Polo, who was probably born here in 1254, and reminders of him can be seen all around the town. After the tour, enjoy free time to explore Korčula at your own pace, browse local shops, stop for gelato or a coffee, and taste local cuisine in one of the town's excellent restaurants.

Dinner on your own. Overnight Korčula.

Tuesday, September 21 - Hvar



Breakfast on board while we set sail to the island of Hvar. Often called the queen of the Dalmatian islands, Hvar has been celebrated since ancient times for its strategic nautical position, layered history, vibrant culture, and remarkable natural beauty. From fragrant lavender fields and sun-drenched hillsides to pine forests and crystal-clear coves, the island feels like the Adriatic at its most iconic. Although Radoslav was born in Zagreb, Hvar Town is now his home when he is not in the United States.

Along the way we will pause for a swim stop, giving you a chance to cool off in the sparkling sea. After lunch, we will disembark and meet our local guide for a private walking tour through the historic center. Hvar is one of the most sought-after destinations on the coast, attracting the rich and famous, something that becomes obvious in summer when the harbor is filled with sleek sailboats and mega yachts. While many come for the beaches, world-class dining, and lively nightlife, this sunny island offers far more than its glamorous reputation.

As you explore, you will see elegant Venetian-era architecture, charming stone lanes, and picturesque squares that open toward the waterfront. One of the highlights is the Španjola Fortress, perched above town and rewarding those who climb with panoramic views over the rooftops, harbor, the sea, and the Pakleni Islands scattered across the horizon. Hvar Town is also home to Europe's oldest continuously running public theater, dating back more than 400 years.

Evening at leisure to explore the riva, enjoy gelato or drinks, take a short stroll to view the Franciscan Monastery, which often appears in Rad's social media photos, and choose from Hvar's excellent restaurants for dinner on your own. Overnight Hvar.

Wednesday, September 22– Stari Grad (Island Hvar)



In the morning, the ship will sail around the island of Hvar as you enjoy a relaxing cruise into one of the Adriatic's deepest, most secluded bays. A late-morning swim is the perfect start to the day. We will arrive in Stari Grad in the early afternoon hours.

Stari Grad, known in antiquity as Pharos, is the oldest town in Croatia and the historical heart of Hvar Island. In 384 B.C., the same year Greek philosopher Aristotle was born, settlers from the island of Paros in the Aegean Sea founded a colony here and named it Pharos. Today, "Stari Grad" means "old town," and it lives up to its name with a timeless atmosphere and a beautiful waterfront setting.

The town sits where the blue of the bay meets the green of the wide and famous Stari Grad Plain, a UNESCO-protected landscape of vineyards and olive groves that have been cultivated for centuries. The fields once provided sustenance, while the bay offered safe shelter for ships. A walk through the historic center, with its narrow stone streets and small squares, brings the past to life at every turn.

We will start with a walking tour of Stari Grad, then board a bus for a Hvar Island tour with visits to charming villages, plus a stop at a local family winery for a tasting of Hvar's distinctive wine varieties.

Dinner on your own. Back on the ship in the late evening for a concert with Ellis and Rad. Overnight in Stari Grad.

In the morning, we will sail to Maslinica, a peaceful harbor village on the western tip of the island Šolta. Tucked into a sheltered bay and framed by pine-covered hills, Maslinica feels like a true Adriatic hideaway, with stone houses, a small waterfront riva, and views of a necklace of tiny islets just offshore. The water here is famously clear and calm, and the pace is unhurried, making it easy to slip into island time as soon as we arrive.

Maslinica's harbor is a favorite stop for sailboats and yachts from across the Adriatic, creating a picture-perfect skyline of masts along the waterfront. Even in peak season, it keeps its relaxed, local feel, and it is not frequently visited by small cruise ships, which makes our time here feel extra special. Spend the afternoon at leisure to swim, enjoy a coffee or gelato by the sea, or simply settle in along the riva and watch the boats come and go.

If you would like to see more of Šolta beyond Maslinica, join us on an optional Šolta island excursion, including a visit to a family-run olive oil factory.

Captain's Dinner on board tonight, followed by a concert with Ellis and Rad. Overnight in Maslinica.

Friday, September 24 – Split (or nearby port TBA)



In the morning, we will sail toward our final destination, the beautiful and vibrant town of Split. Split's story stretches back 17 centuries to the reign of the Roman Emperor Diocletian, who built his palace on a peninsula near the great Roman city of Salona, intending it as a place to spend his later years. Over time, the palace gradually transformed into a thriving city, and today Split continues to captivate visitors with its rich tradition, remarkable history, and stunning natural and cultural setting.

Diocletian's Palace is Split's must-see landmark and the living heart of Croatia's second-largest city. Nearly two thousand years old, it remains a true "living monument," with shops, galleries, cafés, and restaurants woven into its ancient walls, and locals still living and working within the palace complex. That rare blend of everyday life and ancient Roman history is what makes Split so unforgettable. Join us for a private sightseeing tour of Split's UNESCO-protected Old Town, then enjoy your evening in Split with your fellow travelers.

Dinner on your own. Overnight in Split.

Please note: due to port construction in Split, which is expected to be completed in late 2027, there is a possibility that our final port and debarkation may take place at a nearby port such as Trogir. We will keep everyone updated as plans are confirmed.


Cabins
